CHARACTER



The Year of Celebration Character Award rewards recipients for engaging in an active conversation about living by the Scout Law. The award involves elements of citizenship, family life, and personal fitness. Scouts will reflect on their own character and values. Adults and alumni will rediscover the impact Scouting makes on their own character.

Complete three of the five requirements in each category to earn that award.

Boy Scouts

- 1. Participate in a flag ceremony, in uniform, for a non-Scouts organization.
- 2. Earn one of the Citizenship merit badges.
- **3.** Present a written record of your daily Good Turns for a period of 30 consecutive days, verified by your parent, guardian, or Scout leader.
- **4.** Provide two hours of assistance at an activity conducted by a Cub Scout pack, another troop or team, or other youth-serving organization approved by your Scout leader.
- **5.** Conduct a family project (such as the examples found in the Family Life merit badge pamphlet) approved by your Scout leader.

NATIONAL OUTDOORS AWARD BADGE

The program, conceived by the volunteer-led National Camping Task Force of the BSA, includes a series of five badges designed to recognize a Boy Scout or Varsity Scout who has demonstrated knowledge and experience in performing high-level outdoor activities.

The five categories are:

Camping
Hiking
Riding
Aquatics
Adventure

Boys can apply for and earn any or all of the badges during their time in the program. To earn the award or awards, a Boy Scout or Varsity Scout must complete:

Relevant merit badges, which vary for each award.

- The First Class rank.
- Leave No Trace requirements.
- Activities measured by nights of camping, miles of hiking, miles of horseback riding, hours on or in the water, and other adventure activities.

Detailed requirements and application forms will be provided via MyScouting.org in early 2010. Scouts may count activities completed in previous years to qualify for these awards. Now, if those five awards aren't enough, there's the ultimate prize: the National Medal for Outdoor Achievement, which will be the highest outdoor adventure award in Scouting. The requirements for that medal are:

- Complete all five National Outdoor Award badges.
- Earn four additional outdoor merit badges.
- · Receive training in Wilderness First Aid.
- Finish the Boy Scout Leave No Trace Trainer certification.
- Plan and lead a unit outing or serve as a youth staff member at a Council summer camp.

JAMBOREE DAY TRIP

The Occoneechee Council will lead a bus trip to Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia to visit the Jamboree on Friday, July 30, 2010. This once-in-a-lifetime experience will depart Raleigh at approximately 5:00 a.m. and return the same day at approximately 11 p.m. Visitors will have between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. to observe and visit the 65,000 Scouts and Scouters who comprise the 100th Anniversary's largest and best display of Boy Scouting in the USA!

Who can attend? Registered Occoneechee Council youth, adults, and their family members; family and friends of the Occoneechee Jamboree contingent members; and Scouting alumni. Youth, ages 5 to 17, must be accompanied by an adult. Children under five years old are not permitted.

What is the cost? \$50 per person. Includes round-trip coach bus transportation fees, custom souvenir items designed only for this Day Trip group, and dinner on the way home.

What is the process to sign up? Registration paperwork and full payment must be completed in full by April 1, 2010. www.ocscouts.org/location.

Important considerations: Participants should be prepared to walk a minimum of eight to ten miles over the course of the day. All participants will be expected to complete and carry health information and a medical release form on their person (registered BSA members can use their Annual Health and Medical Record).

IOLS Being Revised

Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills is being revised! The new course will be a 'One-Size-Fits-All' for Webelos Leaders, Scout Leaders and Venturing Leaders. Once a person completes the revised course, it is no longer going to be required to take it again when they change programs. BALOO will remain a required, separate training as it focuses more on Safety than Outdoor Skills.
