Shawn's trail to Eagle achievements included: Arrow of Light - Feb. 2003; Scout - May 2003; Tenderfoot - Aug 2003; 2nd Class - June 2004; 1st Class - Sept 2005; Star - May 2006; Life - Nov 2006 and Eagle - April 2009. He earned 41 Merit Badges along the way, was a member of the Order of the Arrow and held several leadership positions within the troop. He attended Camp Raven Knob and Philmont.

Shawn's Eagle Scout project was constructing 2(two) sixteen by twenty (16' x 20') community tent pads at Catfish Cove in Shinleaf Park at Falls Lake State Park. The park was in dire need of closing 3 to 4 group campsites due to severe erosion and therefore needed level-ground group tent pads at campsites constructed. This enabled Shinleaf Park to open Catfish Cover for a group campsite area in the Fall of 2008.

Scouting has a proud tradition of producing great leaders. Self-determination, teamwork, and preparedness are synonymous with Scouts everywhere. For Scouting's 100th Anniversary, let's celebrate this tradition of developing youth leaders.

The Year of Celebration Leadership Award encourages Scouts to explore and reflect upon the qualities of a good leader. The award recipients will work on leadership skills. The Leadership Award rewards participants for reflecting upon and sharing leadership lessons and skills. Scouts earning this award will look to role models, lead groups, and participate in leadership-building activities. Adults and alumni will build their unit leadership skills by emphasizing membership growth, volunteering, and providing role models.

Complete three of the five requirements in each category to earn that award.

Boy Scouts

- 1. Identify someone from your Scouting experience you think is a good leader. Ask them what makes them an effective leader and then talk to your parent or Scoutmaster about what makes a good leader. Write 200 words on the leader you chose and share with your troop leader.
- 2. Teach a Scout a rank requirement and help them to a successful completion.
- 3. Serve in a troop or team leadership position for three months.
- **4.** Serve as a youth staff member for a unit, district, or council event or camp.
- **5.** Serve as a den chief for a Cub Scout or Webelos den for three months.

2010 Rank Requirement Changes

The centennial edition of the Boy Scout Handbook has several rank requirement changes that are now in effect.

Tenderfoot

A Scout must teach another person how to tie a square knot using the EDGE model (explain, demonstrate, guide, and enable). He must also be able to discuss four specific examples of how he lived the points of the Scout Law in his daily life.

Second Class

- A Scout must discuss the principles of Leave No Trace and explain the factors to consider when choosing a patrol site and where to pitch a tent.
- He must explain what respect is due the flag of the United States.
- He must again discuss four examples of how he lived four different points of the Scout Law in his daily
- He must earn an amount of money agreed upon by the Scout and his parents and save at least 50 percent of it.

First Class

- An additional requirement to the 10 separate troop/patrol activities states he must demonstrate the principles of Leave No Trace on these outings.
- He must discuss four more examples of how he lived the remaining four points of the Scout Law in his daily life.

Life

A Scout must use the EDGE model to teach a younger Scout a specified skill.

Star, Life, and Eagle

Troop Webmaster and Leave No Trace trainer are two new leadership positions.



Wilderness First Aid Basics

This course meets WFA requirement to attend Philmont. You will learn basic instruction on emergency action steps, delayed-help situations, patient assessment & record, treatment of injuries, preventing disease transmission, wilderness and disaster first aid, etc. Cost is \$105.00. Course is 16 hours.

Louisburg Merit Badge University

Great Northern District January 30, 2010

Louisburg Merit Badge University is designed to allow Scouts to complete one or two Merit Badges in one day of classroom, adult-lead instruction and testing. Scouts must complete all prerequisites assigned by their instructor prior to registration. If all prerequisites are not met, then scouts will be reassigned to a merit badge with no prerequisites. Sign up forms and payment must be turned in to the council office no later than Friday, January 15th. There will be no exceptions or late registrations.
