

## **Changes to Eagle Rank Requirements**

Effective January 1, 2012, new changes to the requirements for Eagle rank take effect. These include:

- 1. There will no longer be needed a letter from the Service Project recipient acknowledging satisfactory completion of the project, as this is redundant with the signatures required in the Eagle Workbook.
- 2. There are more detailed guidelines for the Eagle Service Project Fundraising Directors, who oversee the candidates' progress in raising the money necessary to complete the project. Please see the documents posted in our "Eagle Guide' section of our Troop website, www.troop28raleigh.org, for details. This section has the workbook in .pdf files (both printed and 'fillable' versions), as well as answers from the Eagle Review Board, to frequently asked questions. This should prove very helpful to all Eagle rank candidates.
